From the Principal

School Drop Off/Pick Up

Parents are not to drive into the school grounds to drop off or collect children unless specific arrangements have been made with administration to assist parents with emergent or unexpected circumstances that may restrict or prevent normal access for students. Parents have been driving in, mainly before school, placing children arriving at school early and going to the hall at risk. Parents are advised to use the parking zones at the front of the school.

Late Arrivals & Early Departure

Parents please be advised that children arriving late to school and leaving before the last bell MUST present to the school office upon arrival and before departure. Children arriving late are provided with a late slip to take to class. Failure to collect a late slip will most likely result in a message from the school indicating that your child is not present and asking for an explanation for the absence. Children leaving early must be signed out by their parent or carer. Children are not permitted to leave the school grounds during the school day without the relevant permission. This is a necessary arrangement to ensure the school is aware of the whereabouts of each child during the school day and to ensure their safety and wellbeing. Thank you for your support.

Every Day Counts

Attendance at school every day is not only an Education Queensland and legislated requirement, it is absolutely critical to the ongoing learning success for all children. Every day a child misses, puts them at a slight disadvantage as learning in our classrooms is a continuous process, leaving children work to catch up with as well as work to continue on with. Often work missed is a prerequisite to work that follows, so children are actually unable to complete the new work until the work they have missed is caught up. This often causes them considerable distress.

Our attendance target for 2023 remains at 95%. This means that children need to be in attendance for 190 days (or more) out of the 200 school days to meet our attendance target. More than 2.5 days of absence per term will see them fall below the target.

Please help us to ensure the best possible learning outcomes for your child by ensuring attendance at school every possible day.

Slow down around our school

Parents and carers are being urged to slow down in school zones. Most school areas have 40km/hr speed limits in place – our zone is along Webb Road in front of the school. Parents can set an example to other drivers by observing these limits when dropping off and collecting the kids from school. Being cautious and slowing down in school zones doesn't make a big difference to your trip time, but it could save a child's life. Parents should also take the time to teach their children about road safety and the safest ways to travel to and from school.

Some basic tips:

- ensure your child knows the safest route to and from school and insist on them sticking to this route each day so you know where they are
- teach your child to always walk on footpaths
- make sure your child crosses at pedestrian crossings and ensure he/she knows the safe times to cross. This is particularly important at the front of our school and at bus stops on the routes to and from school. A number of parents have been taking children across the bus lane, walking out between buses to do so. This is a dangerous practice and poor role modelling for the children, leading them to think this is OK.





- accompany young children when they are walking or riding to school and assist them with road crossings until they are old enough to understand road safety
- teach your child to be alert for cars going in or out of driveways
- discourage your child from playing with balls or toys while walking to school or waiting for the bus.

Contact with our school

I would like to remind all parents that we welcome your contact with us in regard to your child's progress in class or participation at school. Our classroom teachers are happy to meet with you to discuss progress, our curriculum, issues or concerns throughout the whole year. All that is necessary is to make an appointment through the front office to ensure that your child's teacher is available to talk to you, as they may already have previous engagements. Before school is not the best time to try to catch up with teachers as they are usually busily preparing for the day's learning, however with prior arrangement this time may also be available if other times do not suit your work schedules.

You may, at times, also receive contact from teachers if they feel the need to bring you up to date with particular aspects of your child's participation or progress in class.

Reminder to Parents/Guardians.

Just a reminder to all parents, children are not to bring toys, trading cards (e.g. Pokémon) or any portable electronic devices or electronic toys to school.

These items can go missing or be broken and as such are not to be brought unless for a specific in class purpose.

A reminder also that mobile phones, tablets or devices capable of recording – audio or images – are to be left at the office when students arrive and picked up at the end of the school day. Children do not need these devices during the day as our office staff contact parents whenever necessary. These devices are available for students before and after school or on the buses in case out of school contact is required by the student. This has been our school policy on electronic devices for a number of years.

Queensland Engagement and Wellbeing Survey

In Term 2, students in Years 4 - 6 will be asked to take part in the Queensland Engagement and Wellbeing (QEW) Survey.

We know that wellbeing and engagement are important parts of your child's life at school. The QEW Survey is designed to measure how students view their wellbeing and engagement across different topics. The information we get from the survey helps us better understand and support our students.

An information letter will be sent out to parents and carers closer to the time. If you have any questions, please contact the school. The P&C is a group of volunteers working together to improve the facilities and opportunities available at your school. Your volunteering contribution to the P&C can be as large or small as you can manage!


